

Things to remember

The walk into the caves is uneven and while we provide some assistance, you will need to be reasonably confident on your feet. In the caves the light can be poor and in some places non-existent. Those suffering a fear of close spaces should be mindful of this.




Spectacular Geology

The spectacular and delicate limestone formations, brilliantly vivid colours and icy cold, crystal clear freshwater pools are all that remain of the Devonian Great Barrier Reef that was formed over 350 million years ago. Mimbi cave system reveals ancient large scale fossilised reefs that are amongst the best preserved in the world.

Your guides will share a wealth of information on how the cave systems were formed, pointing out various rock formations including speleothems, tall slender stalagmites, shawls, flowstones and sparkling calcite crystals formed over millennia.



Girloorloo Tours - Mimbi Caves


The tour begins with a fascinating walk through to the caves entrance. Along the way your guide will share traditional knowledge of local bush tucker, bush medicine and the native flora and fauna found around the cave system.

In places, natural light enters the cave system through holes in the cave roof making it possible to navigate through the cave and casting light on ancient rock paintings, each of which has its own unique connection to the caves and local people.

Gooniyandi People

Mimbi is at the heart of Gooniyandi country. Radiocarbon dating from ancient fireplaces confirm that Aboriginal people have inhabited this part of the Kimberley for more than 40,000 years.

Your Gooniyandi guide will share ancient Dreamtime stories about how the caves and freshwater pools were created. Your guide will also share the location of ancient rock paintings and petroglyphs, further evidence of Aboriginal peoples long connection with Mimbi Caves and the surrounding country.
