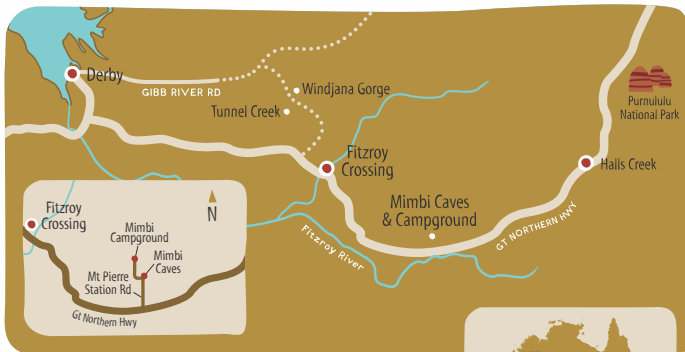

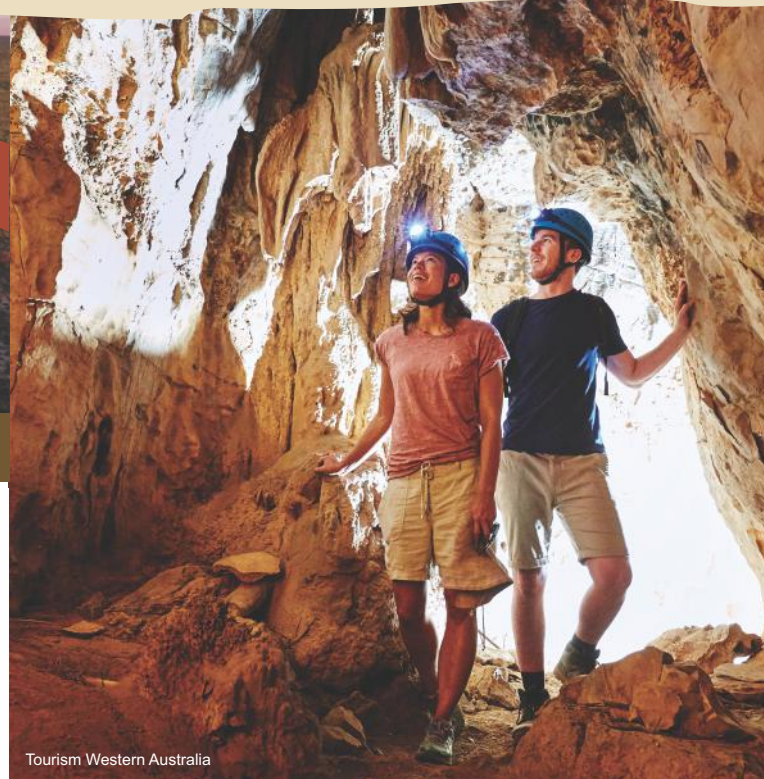

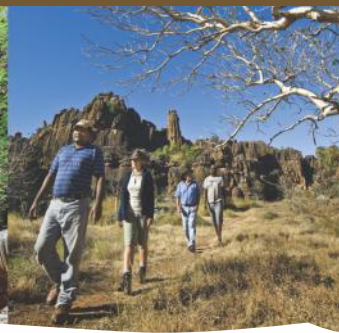

Mimbi Caves at the heart of Gooniyandi country is part of the 350 million year old Devonian Reef system. Radiocarbon dating from ancient fireplaces confirm that Aboriginal people have inhabited this part of the Kimberley for more than 40,000 years.

Mimbi Caves Campground - Jarlarloo Riwi

Modern amenities, hot showers, BBQ shelter, secluded camp sites and a friendly welcome awaits you at Mimbi Caves Campground. Nestled at the foot of the Emmanuel Ranges and just a short drive off Great Northern Highway, the campground has a Gooniyandi name "Jarlarloo Riwi"; Jarlarloo meaning Coolamon tree and Riwi meaning camp.
